Modern Language Requirement

In those programs that require world language, students may elect to enroll in any world language offered at Bristol Community College, including American Sign Language. Under Massachusetts law, ASL is recognized as the equivalent of a spoken language for the purpose of world language study and course credit. Students may also receive transfer credit for modern languages not offered at Bristol.
